### **Pastoral Introduction**

God's love and power extend over all of creation. Every life, including our own, is precious to God. Christians have always believed that there is hope in death as there is in life, and that there is new life in Christ over death. Even those who share such faith find that there is a real sense of loss at the death of a loved one.

The funeral liturgy contains several elements:

# Telling the story

- an opportunity to reflect on a life's story, and calling to mind the ways in which one life touched others

#### Give thanks

- for life in its richness and diversity. There person who has died will have meant different things to different people.

# Saying goodbye

- to acknowledge that every death brings both an ending, and a new beginning

#### Commend

- to ask the safe transition of the spirit / permanent character of the deceased into whatever is believed to lie beyond death

#### Commit

- to lay to rest the mortal remains of the deceased

# • Continue the journey

-to give the bereaved inspiration and hope to resume their lives in the knowledge that although things have irretrievably changed, there is still an ongoing journey to navigate

# The Shape of the Funeral Liturgy in the Episcopal Church

**Gathering** the Funeral Celebrant welcomes everyone and 'sets the tone' of the ceremony.

A Eulogy may also be given at this point

**Remembering** A time to give thanks for the departed, to recall stories and memories, and

honor the life of the departed

# **Readings / Reflections**

Particular readings, poems, music, other words are shared.

**Prayers** Comfort for those who mourn, and an opportunity to express a commitment

to continue our own life's journeys in hope and trust

**Entrusting** The deceased's soul is commended to God's keeping

**Farewell** To say goodbye, and to commit the body for burial or cremation
